Secretary Bowling opened the meeting and welcomed everyone in attendance. Self-introductions were made. She reviewed the agenda with the group. She shared with the group that she is very proud of the work being done by this group and the collaboration being done in our State.

Work Group Updates:

Anne Williams – Better Health

- She thanked Nancy Sullivan for working close with the Better Health Work Group. Joint meetings of Better Health and Better Care were held in May June and July.
- May: DHHR Safe at Home WV – demonstration project that provides wraparound behavioral health and social services to 12-17 year olds in the state.
- June: WV SIM Grant and State Health System Innovation Plan Presentation
- July: Preston Memorial Hospital – Sunday Shoes Program. They monitored pedal edema in heart failure patients as a marker. Very innovative program. Tried their Sunday shoes on every day and when the shoes began to get tight, an indicator to check in with their health care provider. Readmission rates dropped to zero.

Nancy Sullivan – Better Care

- Wants to continue the process going forward by joining with Better Health.
- New Three Branch initiative with NGA looking at improving child safety and reducing child fatality.
- Look at state fatality data. We have three groups that do data. What can we learn from looking at all the data?
- Revisit Safe Sleep, an initiative that was done with Three Branch a few years back. Public Health also doing some work on Safe Sleep. Bring all the groups together. Look at a pilot in our 12 FEMA areas. Work with project groups that are doing flood relief.

Jeremiah Samples – Better Value

- Several presentations on School Based Health Services – next meeting we will have a formalized listing of different goals, objectives, timeframes, current values, etc. Focusing on obesity, tobacco use, substance abuse and behavioral health, and how school based health can be used as a mechanism to provide these services to children.
- Started discussion on improving health to get and keep individuals in the Work Force. Heard presentation from ResCare. Will continue to work on this issue with the collaborative.

Final SIM Update – Josh Austin

Secretary Bowling introduced Josh Austin, SIM Project Coordinator who will be sharing the final SIM update.

- Shared the Plan Wrap Up Timeline.
- Shared the timeline of the process for completion of the final plan and the public comment period process.
- Final Plan submitted on July 21 and submitted a small update to CMI. Signed, sealed and delivered and being reviewed by the Feds.
- Press release was sent out and received good media coverage.
- Remaining SIM Activities:
 - Draft article for the West Virginia Medical Journal about the SIM Plan
 - Final project closeout – October 29, 2016
 - Final progress report
 - Final federal financial report
 - Operational plan

Secretary Bowling thanked everyone for all the hard work and energy that was put into the plan.

Accountable Health Communities – Bob Whitler and others

- Thanked everyone that worked on this statewide effort. Shared the AHC Collaborators
- Forty-eight clinical delivery sites
- Cooperative Agreement – US Department of Health and Human Services Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, Center for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation
- 2.57 million over 5 years
- 10% indirect for duration of grant
- Requires State Medicaid Agency participation
- Find out in December if we get the grant – starts in April 2017
- Application deadline was May 18, 2016

- Grant Purpose: Overarching goal is to bring the divide between the clinical healthcare delivery system and community services providers to address health-related social needs, reduce the overall cost of healthcare and increase health equity.
- Shared the research design.
- Universal screening
- Geographic target area – all 55 counties in WV
 - Medicare, Medicaid, Dual-Enrolled, CHIP
 - 296,208 potential offers to screen in WV – 75,000 required by CMS
- Community Resource Inventory
 - Required inventory of local community service providers that provide direct services to meet health-related social needs – build upon existing WV CED inventory
 - CAPGate System
- Patient Navigation Services
 - Provided to patients with more than 2 emergency department visits in the past 12 months who have screened positive for a health-related social need
 - Navigation Services:
 - Personal interview
 - Develop an action plan
 - Follow-up(s) – resolved or declared not resolvable
 - Documentation
 - Data collection
- Shared a chart with the group about the things liked about the process, things learned, things longed for and things lacked.

A question and answer period followed.

WV State Health Plan – Roger Chaufournier

- The State Health Plan is mandated legislatively under the WV Health Care Authority
- There is a requirement by CMS, CDC, HRSA and other grantors for a thoughtful strategic plan guiding alignment of resources
- Multiple state health planning efforts in WV.
- Shared a traditional planning process, and shared the reality of the current environment planning process with the State SIM Plan, Public Health Plan, Health Improvement Plan and the HIT Plan and involving local stakeholders.
- Shared the SIM Driver Diagram.
- Planning Process:
 - Build off of prior work and synthesize plans during summer 2016
 - Stakeholder engagement and education – Fall of 2016
 - Alignment and fingerprinting – Fall of 2016
 - Plan due by the end of March 2017
- Going out and talking to stakeholders
- Engagement and share of ownership is very important

Discussion followed and ideas were shared. If you have information to share, send to Mr. Chaufournier or one of his colleagues. Josh Austin will be preparing a survey and it will be distributed to the Collaborative to get ideas, suggestions, etc.
